

Saint Paul's Episcopal Church Senior Warden Monthly Report May 2023

Dear Saint Paul's Episcopal Church,

Today is the 31st of May 2023, traditionally Memorial Day, but in the spirit of 3 day week ends, that was celebrated by most of us this past Monday.

Last month, I alluded to our April 30th Parish wide meeting which was pretty well attended after 10 AM Eucharist Service during coffee hour. A respectful discussion of St. Paul's budgetary needs and shortcomings was had. Episcopal Diocese of Eastern Oregon, the Right Reverend Patrick Bell attended the 10 AM service and the coffee hour discussion and summarized the meeting, with insight into the state of the national church, our own diocese and our own church. St. Paul's Priest, the Reverend Jonathan Galles spoke of his own responsibilities to St. Paul's and of his own discernment and discussions with Bishop Pat, St. Paul's Vestry, and his family. He announced that he is seeking a new calling in a yet to be determined parish. This comes as St. Paul's reckons with our inability to financially sustain a full time priest. Several who were present offered their own feelings and floated several ideas for St. Paul's continuation and financial stability. Those ideas and discussions continue.

Vestry met in regular session on May 7th. That agenda and those meeting minutes have been posted on the bulletin board in the church hallway across from the church office. I encourage all to take the time to read them.

Vestry met again in ad hoc session on May 11th to discuss the 3rd offer to purchase the 605/607 Union Street properties and improvements, known to us as "The Diocesan House," and the former "Rectory of the Old St. Paul's." Vestry voted to counter that offer of \$300,000 with \$370,000. The prospective buyer then countered our counter-offer, proposing to pay \$340,000. Vestry met again on Sunday May 21st to discuss this, the 4th offer. Vestry voted to accept the offer. The Diocesan House and property and adjacent property are currently "in escrow."

Vestry will meet this Saturday June 3nd for their annual Vestry Retreat in Wahkiacus, Washington at the home of Chuck and Pam Miller. The Reverend Jonathan Galles has prepared a program of information, reflection and discussion for this gathering which will start at 9 AM and continue through 4 PM. Senior Warden will summarize the meeting for St. Paul's congregation on Sunday June 4th.

Last, I would like to extend a hearty welcome to Anne Kanter, new to Saint Paul's, now living her husband in High Prairie, Washington. She comes from the Parish of St. Benedict's in Los Osos, California and her warm presence is greatly appreciated. She will be succeeding Anne Ketchum as Choir Director. More on this next month. Thank you, Anne and Anne.



Las Florecitas De San Cristobal Group's story

Kelin is a twenty-eight-year-old woman, married to a music teacher and the mother of a two-year-old child. With great determination, she managed

to graduate from secondary school with a degree in tourism, working for seven years in her profession.

For two years, Kelin has worked in weaving and selling huipiles, also called traditional blouses. She supports herself with one of her sisters and mother to deliver the orders on time. To be able to continue producing these textiles, Kelin asks for her fourth Kiva loan. She has planned to purchase a variety of high-quality thread. As a medium-term goal, she wants to purchase a vehicle to go out of her community and sell her product.

Eight Maya Kaqchikel women, including Kelin, live in the department/state of Chimaltenango. All the clients work weaving and selling traditional clothing. These women have joined together to participate in Friendship Bridge's Microcrédito Plus program (loans, education, and health). Their communal bank is called Las Florecitas de San Cristóbal.

They appreciate the monthly meetings of educational trainings which cover relevant topics taken from 4 areas: business, family, women, and health. Some of the topics which stand out are empowerment, health, over-indebtedness, budgeting, self-esteem, and good business management. Thank you, Kiva lenders and Friendship Bridge, for being interested in the development of Maya women in Guatemala!

items she can sell for an income. Neighbors and women from her community started coming in to help as much as they can by buying from her. She has many customers now and needs help to keep up. A loan will help her buy sheets to sell.

Arañitas De Villa Mercedes C Group's story

Romelia is a hardworking woman who learned the job of making mantas at a young age. Mantas are a traditional women's garment worn over a skirt in the western area of

Bolivia. She managed to finish high school, but was unable to continue studying something specific since the need to work was greater.

She and her friends make up the group called "Arañitas de Villa Mercedes C." They got their name because of their ability to work, and also because the majority of them work weaving garments. She is the president of the group, and her main task was to take the group to Sembrar Sartawi IFD where they received necessary advice and financing to achieve their objective.

In Romelia's case, she needs the money to purchase raw material and to repair her weaving machine.
