HOLY COMMUNION THIS SUNDAY - JULY 27th

Hello everyone,

Holy communion will be offered this Sunday. So what will the **NEW** process for Holy Communion look like? As you might have already guessed, receiving communion will look different, but it will be a safe way for us to share in Holy Communion together. The usher will release each row one by one as people go to the front of the altar area to receive communion.

The priest will hand each person a wafer with these words, "The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven." Amen.

Each person will then go to where the glasses are filled with wine, pick one up, and face the Eucharistic Minister and hear these words, "The Blood of Christ, the cup of Salvation." Amen.

Following the completion of receiving communion, people will place their empty glass container in a metal tray, and move on down the far right aisle to the back of the church, where you can then find your original seating.

I hope this brief explanation will ease your concerns on receiving Holy Communion in a worshipful and safe manner. See you Sunday.



Your Vestry met on June 13th.

We celebrated re-opening, currently using Morning Prayer but planning on full eucharist this Sunday, June 27th.

Vestry business included the approval of our parish profile as we progress in the rector search process. But as part of this discussion it was voiced that we need additional members of the search committee. Many of you were asked earlier this year to be on the Search Committee, but as time has progressed and the Search Committee has met for the first time, the need for further volunteers to serve is necessary. **PLEASE** consider throwing your hat in the ring for this important task. 
