Community Garden Annual Report - 2021

The eight raised-beds at St. Paul's again provided fresh vegetables for area food banks in 2021 in spite of the ravages of both hot weather and an upsurge in the ground squirrel population. After two or three re-plantings a chicken-wire perimeter fence and cover allowed the leafy plants to grow. Such a struggle it was!



As always, the tomatoes were plentiful, the squash were planted too close together, and at times the irrigation system was irregular considering the warmer than normal temperatures. A cover crop of oats has survived the winter and soon will be turned-under to add to the organic composition of one bed. It'll be interesting to see if the production from that particular bed will out-produce the others in 2022.

Gardening will soon start anew as the last frost approaches with radishes, lettuce, tomatoes, squash, green beans, beets, peppers and onions being planted for local food bank distribution.

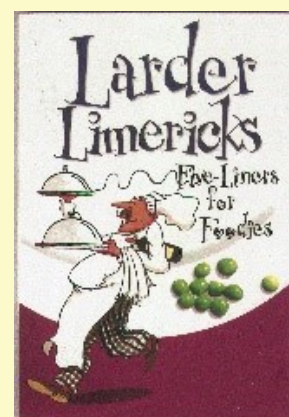
